Getting There

Hayward is located about one hour's drive east of us. Driving directions are:

- Out our driveway and back down to Highway 48.
- Left on Hwy 48 and cross the St. Croix River into Wisconsin where the highway becomes Wisconsin 77.
- Follow Wisconsin 77 through Danbury, through Minong and on to Hayward. (Don't miss the Highway 77 turn 2 miles north of Danbury or you'll end up in Superior!)



Shopping

A very enjoyable day can be spent strolling down Main Street and browsing through the many unique shops. More good shops are located a block or so off Main Street and a few more are scattered around town.

Sandra's favorite shops in town are **Lodge Accents** and **Ahlgren's Home Accents**, both located on Main Street.

The creative talent behind both of the "Accents" shops is owner Mika Ahlgren, shown here with Sandra.

If you are lucky, you will see Natalie Hegeman, who has been making candy at **Tremblay's** for 40 years, stirring two pots of candy at once in the front window.



The **Leather Factory**, located a block off Main Street, has hundreds of homemade leather items.

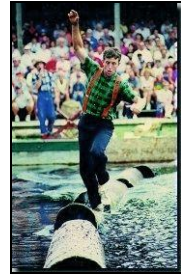


Entertainment

The **National Fresh Water Fishing Hall of Fame** is located at the intersection of Highway B & 27 in Hayward. Eating

For lunch or dinner we recommend **The Angry Minnow Brew Pub** at Highway 63 and Florida Avenue toward the south end of Hayward. Located in one of Hayward's oldest buildings, The Angry Minnow features a full menu and bar, including beer brewed on the premises. Happily, there is **NO SMOKING** allowed inside the building.
